CHRISTMAS PUDDING



BUBBLE AND SQUEAK



If you can wear a patterned festive jumper, do, unless you can't. Jumpers may only be worn from 23 to 27 December. A maximum of six at a time may be worn in any one household, except in Scotland where up to three revellers are required to wear two jumpers each.

No more than three sixpences to be present in any one pudding unless the number of diners exceeds six, in which case the number of sixpences can be increased by 0.5 per person except where euros or bitcoins have been substituted.

Any number of potatoes and cabbages may form a bubble and squeak. The amount of squeak must not exceed the amount of bubble unless you are in Wales, in which case your

bubble is required to squeak.

PRESENT EXCHANGE



IGLOO FORMATION



A household member who has ingested Brussels Sprouts will have to self-isolate from the rest of their household for a minimum period of four hours. Alternatively they may decamp to a local park, but are required to wear a mask except when not doing so.

A maximum of six medium-sized presents may be exchanged within the same bubble. All presents must be wrapped in the same festive paper and presented inside a stocking, except for Tier 3 areas, where the only gifts allowed are ones definable as 'substantial meals'.

North Pole residents may be allowed to form an igloo with two other households, subject to alcohol assessments. Social drinking should be maintained, with regular hohohoing to reduce risk of inebriation.

The consumption of sherry with mince pies is limited to persons named Nicholas. No more than six sherries may be consumed in any one sitting. There is no limit to mince pies, subject to beltwearing restrictions.

Christmas cakes must be presented in three tiers, except in Ireland where five levels are required. Only one snowperson, one reindeer and one wooden fence may mingle on the top tier. Dried fruit may mix in all tiers other than Tier 1 and Tier 2.

Travel by any means other than sleigh will entail wearing full armour. The armour must have at least three layers and fully cover the nose as well as the mouth. NB: Travellers to rural Durham must be in hazmat suits and have obtained form UMSTBJKNG from an approved optician.
